Burswood plans get revved up

This is one of of the images the State Government hopes will win over critics of its controversial \$217.5 million Burswood redevelopment plan.

Premier Roger Cook will today unveil concept plans for an ampitheatre, community building and other sporting facilities he says will be unlike anything the city has seen.

Now to be known as Perth Park, the 28ha precinct is set to deliver \$6lm in economic benefits each year for the next three decades, according to a summary of a long-awaited business

The project is now headed for a start date of early next yea and completion expected in 2027.

"This precinct — unlike anything we have in WA — has something for everyone and when complete, it will be a place all Western Australians can be proud of," Premier Roger Cook told The Sunday Times.

Mr Cook said Perth Park would become the city's premier entertainment and sporting precinct, incorporating Optus Stadium, Crown Perth and Belmont Park racecourse.

Part of the site has also been slated for a new hospitality venue.
