



Cook's 7 Cities to be linked by world's longest racetrack

WA's Cook Government has announced the 7 Cities Vision which aims to give our major regional hubs exactly what they need: a giant racetrack.

The enormous racetrack will go through Broome, Port Hedland, Karratha, Gero, Bunbury, Albany and Kalgoorlie and will be purpose built for both V8s and road trains depending on the occasion.

A source close to the Government said the quality of track meant that emergency supplies could be sent between the cities using the raw power of a V8 Supercar. Adding,
